REPORTING PERIOD: JANUARY 2017

SECTION A - MONTHLY BRIEF

Food Security

The prolonged dry spell has seriously affected Isiolo County and its Environs. The most affected areas in the County of Isiolo have benefitted from government aid of both food and cash donations. The **'Relief from the President'** aid was distributed through the County Commissioners Office and the Ministry of Devolution.

The provisions which consisted of cooking oil, beans, rice and maize were distributed to affected households with the assistance of the local administration.

Meanwhile, the County Disaster Department shared its plans to fund fuel supply to boost operations of power pumped water boreholes. In addition, the department also plans to distribute food aid to primary schools in the **'food for fees'** programme, and provide relief for the entire community.

Elderly Open Day

It was a new dawn for new beneficiaries whose membership was confirmed by the foundation. These are the 50 households which were recruited in the 4th quarter of the year 2016; bringing the total number of benefitting households to 300 HH.

An elderly open day was conducted as part of their coming on board to the Elderly Program during which key issues were discussed including:

- Respect for religious and ethnic diversity
- Review of the beneficiary policy
- Membership
- Relief management by households
- Disciplinary issues

To many of these elderly beneficiaries, their struggle to fend for themselves was over. It was a moment of joy, overwhelming and mixed emotions of laughter, anxiety, tears, and endless appreciation.

Beneficiaries who were advanced in age, were accompanied by representatives whom they gave consent to collect food on their behalf during subsequent distributions.

The food distribution exercise for January 2017 commenced on the 6th January, 2017, and ended on the 24th January 2017.

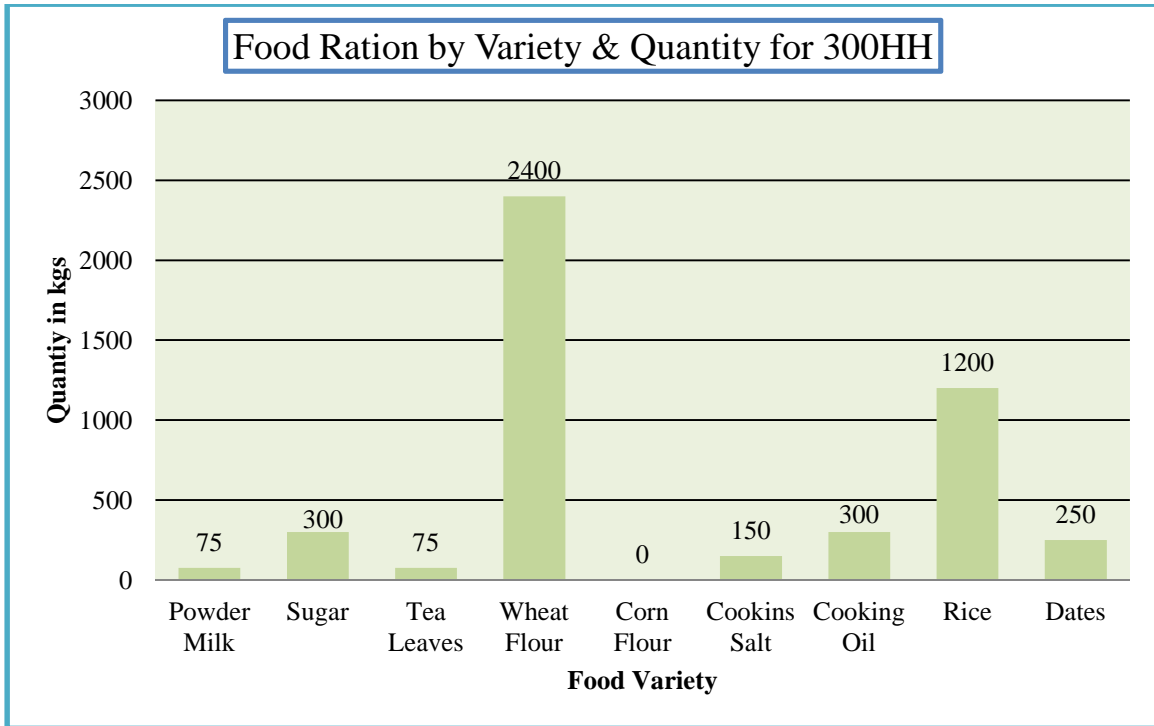
Many households collected their rations within the scheduled period, except for a few ailing beneficiaries.

The food varieties were available with no scarcity experienced in this month.

Door to Door deliveries

Four households had their rations taken to their homes as the beneficiaries were bedridden with no one to assist them in collecting their rations. The door to door deliveries also included the new entrants.

HEALTH**MOBILIZATION OF ELDERLY FOR A MEDICAL CAMP**

The Governor of Kenya Red Cross, Dr. Mohamoud Said, paid a courtesy call to the Foundations headquarters in Isiolo County. During his visit, he took the privilege to meet and welcome the new beneficiaries to the Foundation. He further asked the team to mobilize persons, who have illnesses that require surgery to attend the medical camp scheduled on the 26th February 2017 for free treatment.

The medical camp is organized and funded by the Pedro Cavadas Fundacion in Garba Tulla, Isiolo County.

NHIF-National Hospital Insurance Fund

The foundation carried out an awareness campaign to sensitize the beneficiaries on the importance of accessing the health insurance fund through NHIF. It was discovered that a significant number of beneficiaries were unaware of their membership and the associated benefits of accessing medical care fully covered by the government.

Medical Camp

The Foundation informed the elderly to submit information on their health status in preparation for the 2nd medical camp scheduled for July 2017.

Beneficiary undergoes successful Surgery

Mr. Yusuf Hashi, beneficiary No. K/105 underwent a successful heart surgery early this year. Mr. Hashi had been hospitalized at the MP Shah Hospital in Nairobi for a period of two months due to a heart condition. A heart pacemaker was successfully implanted in his heart, prompting his discharge from the same hospital. Though so frail, he is hopeful that his health will be fully restored.

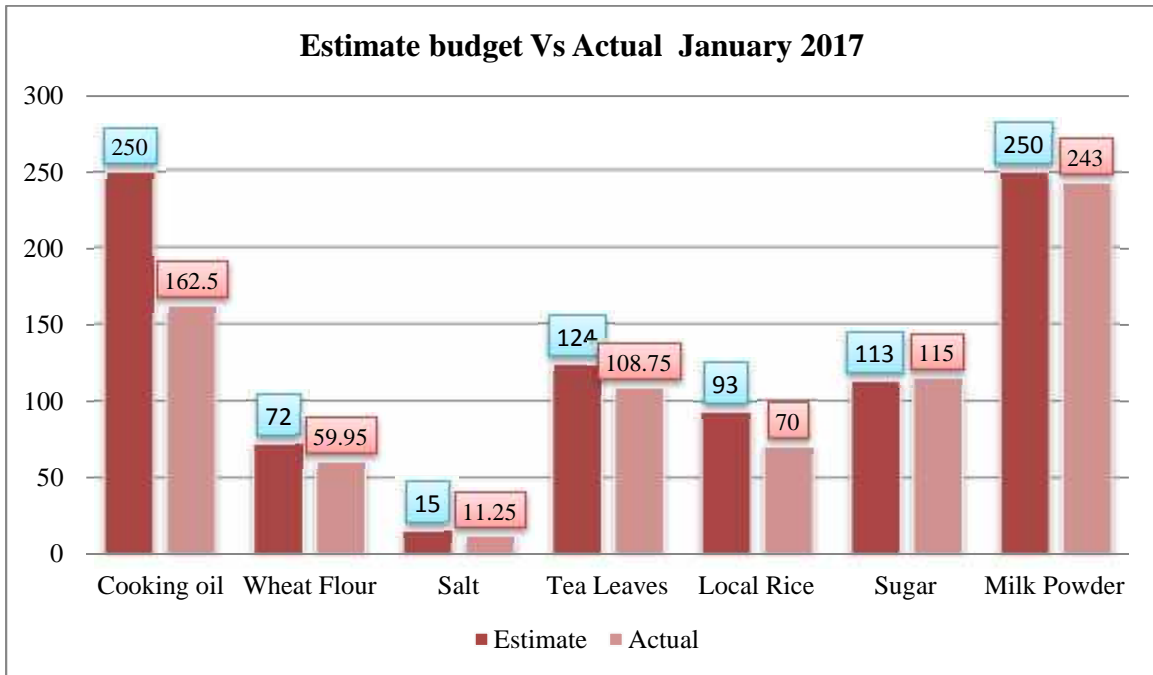
The data represents hospitalized cases and out- patient cases: that have been reported to the Foundation and /or recorded through monitoring which is made through occasional visits to households.

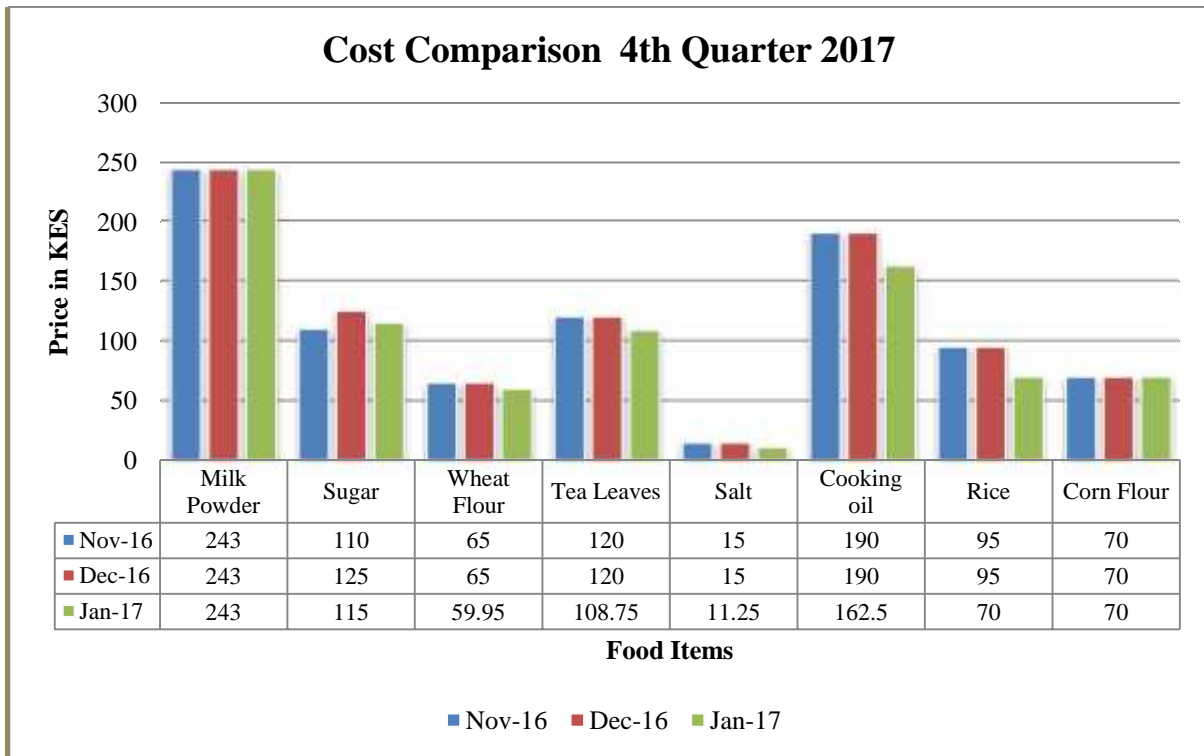
